Water is off for the season. Sometimes in the evening you can see otters in the harbor and evidence of them on the floating dock as well as on the pier.

As some of you might know, Jim Foster started keeping oysters from the <u>Chesapeake Bay Foundation</u> in baskets in the harbor in 2020. Then Covid, then other stuff and finally 9 of the 10 baskets were pulled (missing one). Some baskets had nothing but empty shells but about 6 were full with big "You want a piece of me?" oysters. They have been moved them to the bayfront near the middle of the pier where other oysters have established.

If we decide to do it again, the oysters might do better in floating baskets.

Jim Foster met with a contractor to provide a proposal to complete some structural upgrades on the pier. An engineer inspected and evaluated the pier and provided recommended repairs including better fastening of the handrail, improved supports for the walkway where it goes over the shoreline (span is too long for the existing beams), and other minor attachments. The contractor is recommending against redecking the entire pier as initially suggested and instead continue to replace boards as needed. He will need to remove the walkway decking for the first 30 feet to work on the superstructure underneath.

Trash update—As you may know, the county stopped picking up the trash and recycling from the community receptacles without notifying us. They finally returned our calls and said we need to pay for trash pickup. We have agreed to be billed going forward.

Please note an open date is not a guarantee of availability. Email requests are processed in the order they are received. The calendar is updated immediately after the email is reviewed and a hold is placed.

Other Important notes on renting the Community House:

- Private Community House rentals are for Cedarhurst on the Bay residents and property owners only!
- The resident that rents the house MUST be onsite at the event at all times!
- Rental fees are \$150/day, plus a refundable \$150 security deposit.
- If your date is available, it will be held for <u>10 days</u> while you submit paperwork and fees. You will receive a reply email with the lease, waiver, and submission instructions.
- After completed paperwork, rental fee, and security deposit are received, a booking confirmation will be sent via email.

Hello Cedarhurst.

I hope everyone enjoyed the holidays. As we enter these next couple of months I wanted to talk about some issues related to the cold weather we may be facing. From what I understand it is supposed to be a very cold winter.

If you are planning on being outdoors for an extended period of time consider dressing in layers. I recently bought a battery powered heated jacket which is an amazing option as well. If you are out in the snow or rain try to limit your time. The wetter you get the colder you get. This goes for sweating as well. Take breaks and seek shelter in a warm area. Know the signs of hypothermia; numbness, discolored skin, inability to move easily, and low energy are a few.

For your home, insulate all your outdoor exposed fixtures or pipes. Keep windows closed. If you are using a fireplace or wood burning stove make sure to have a carbon monoxide detector and/ or make sure the batteries are good. Have flashlights and candles handy in the event of a power outage. If you use oil or propane heat, make sure there is a clear path to your tank for deliveries.

Finally, let's not forget our furry friends. Make sure to bring dogs or cats inside. Make sure they have access to water and shelter if they are outside. I saw a tip the other day where a woman put water in a crock pot and kept it on the lowest setting to prevent it from freezing. If you are using an ice melt on your walkways, make sure its pet friendly.

Neighborly Tips

- If you see something, say something, please call 911 if you need the police to come. If you don't call, they will not come. You can be anonymous.
- Can emergency vehicles get past your vehicles parked on the street? It's a matter of safety.
- Is your house clearly marked with your house number? Emergency vehicles must be able to clearly see your house number to be able to respond to emergencies.
- If you have questions about projects being done required a permit, call 311. Permits are required for many projects and for various reasons and it's normal to question if the proper permits are issued and are being met. Inquiring before you begin, may save you extra work in the long run.
- Be cautious of children and people in the street during a snow event.
- Try to park your vehicles in your driveway during a snow event so the plows can get down your street.
- Remind your children to stay off the ice in the bay, we don't need any winter water emergencies!
- Safety first, be mindful of overloading your circuits with space heaters on these extra cold nights.
- Remember your elderly or disabled neighbors in this cold weather, make sure they are staying warm and their walkways are clear.
- We have heard a lot of dogs barking, please don't leave your furry friends outside during the cold weather. This includes dogs and cats!

10 Ways to Keep Your Pets Safe When It's Bitter Cold Outside

Winter weather can be rough on our furry friends. Follow these steps from the American Red Cross to help ensure your pet's safety when chilly weather hits their area.

Bring your pets inside during cold weather. Keep your animals inside. The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals® (ASPCA®) reports if pets are left outdoors, they can freeze, become disoriented, lost, stolen, injured or killed. In addition, don't leave pets alone in a car during cold weather, as cars can act as refrigerators that hold in the cold and cause animals to freeze to death.

The Humane Society of the United States adds that if pets cannot come indoors, you should make sure they are protected by a dry, draft-free enclosure large enough to allow them to sit and lie down, but small enough to hold in the pet's body heat. Raise the floor a few inches off the ground and cover it with cedar shavings or straw. Turn the enclosure away from the wind and cover the doorway with waterproof burlap or heavy plastic.

Move other animals or livestock to sheltered areas and make sure they have access to non-frozen drinking water. If the animals are outside, make sure their access to food and water is not blocked by snow drifts, ice or other obstacles.

Protect their paws. Salt and other chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate a pet's paws. Wipe their paws with a damp towel before your pet licks them and irritates their mouth. The ASPCA adds that you can also use petroleum jelly or booties to protect sensitive paws. Use pet-friendly ice melt products.

Take care of their coat and skin. To avoid itchy, flaking skin, the ASPCA recommends keeping your home humidified and towel dry your pet as soon as he or she comes inside. Pay special attention to paws and in between the toes. Remove any snow from between foot pads. If possible, keep your dog's coat longer in winter for warmth. If your dog is short-haired, consider getting a coat or sweater for your pet. Keep pet bathing to a minimum when it's cold to avoid dry skin. If your pet needs a bath, use a moisturizing shampoo.

Antifreeze is a deadly poison. Wipe up spills and store antifreeze out of reach.

Know your pet's limits outdoors. The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) reports you should be aware of how your pet tolerates cold weather and adjust as needed. Consult your veterinarian if you need advice.

Check your engine. A warm vehicle engine can be an appealing heat source for outdoor and feral cats, but it's deadly. Check underneath your car, bang on the hood, and honk the horn before starting the engine to make sure a cat hasn't taken refuge on your engine.

Use space heaters with caution. The heater can burn your pet or be knocked over, possibly starting a home fire.

Watch for hypothermia. If your pet is whining, shivering, anxious, slower than usual or stops moving, seems weak or starts looking for warm places to burrow, get them back inside quickly because they are showing signs of hypothermia. Frostbite is harder to detect and may not be fully recognized until a few days after the damage is done. If you suspect your pet has hypothermia or frostbite, consult your veterinarian immediately.

Be prepared: Winter can bring blizzards and power outages. Prepare an emergency kit and include your pet in your plans. Have enough food, water and medicine (including any prescription medications as well as heartworm and flea/tick preventives) on hand to get through at least five days.

Avoid walking on frozen water. Stay away from frozen ponds, lakes and other water. You don't know if the ice will support your pet's weight and falling through the ice could be deadly.

Dear Cedarhurst Property Owner:

On the back side of this letter is a copy of the two budgets adopted by the Cedarhurst Citizens Association Board of Directors for Fiscal Year 2026, which begins July 1, 2025, and ends June 30, 2026.

One budget is for the Cedarhurst Special Community Benefit District and the other budget is for the Cedarhurst Shore Erosion Control District. The total combined assessment for the two Districts is 0.224/100 of \$109,600,000 (total tax assessment). The tax rate is the same as FY 2025. The allocation of 0.224 is designated for the Cedarhurst Special Community Benefit District and 0.000 is designated for the Cedarhurst Shore Erosion Control District.
